# **Families Served by Clemson Community Care**

In 2023 CCC distributed 332,961 pounds of food to 3,908 families in our service area. Of this amount, 233,361 pounds were donated by individuals, groups, or grocery stores. To meet the demand, CCC spent a total of \$116,370 from donations to purchase an additional 91,143 pounds of food.

As of September 30, 2024, with three months of the year remaining, we had already distributed 247,688 pounds of food and spent a total of \$92,930 to purchase additional food to meet client needs. On average, CCC distributes over 1,600 pounds of food daily.

In order to help stabilize the shelter needs of our clients, to date in 2024, CCC has helped 266 client families with a total of \$61,058 for payment of utility bills. We have spent \$133,612 to assist 198 client families with rent payment.

For every service provided, we talk with our clients individually and go over their expenses and income, their family situation, and any other issues that are relevant to our assistance. We are a partner with them in stabilizing their situations. For every financial commitment our organization makes on their behalf, a client must pay a portion of the bill.

We are grateful for volunteers who serve as client interviewers, and we appreciate their care, compassion, and thoroughness in listening to difficult life stories and making careful decisions.

# **Back to School Workshop and Backpacks**

As we have for many years, CCC again partnered with the local schools in our service area to provide a back to school workshop for our client parents and children.



Principals and guidance counselors from these schools share information and answer questions regarding bus routes, school feeding programs, attendance, scheduling, and

supply needs. This program allows families to begin the school year with all the information they need to get the year off to a great start.

We appreciate Mt. Zion United Methodist Church in Central hosting our Central and Clemson families and the Pendleton Community Center for sharing their space with our Pendleton families. A hot dog dinner and the ice cream truck completed the evening.

Participating families received a backpack packed by CCC individually for each child based on the specific supply list provided by the child's school and grade.

We appreciate the support of the Rotary Club of Clemson for providing funding for this program by purchasing some of the backpacks and supplies needed.

A total of 187 backpacks were provided to students at nine schools in our service area.

# **CCC Corporate Donation Partners**

Certified food pantries are regulated through Feeding America nationally and then through regional food banks. Our regional supervisory agency is Second Harvest Metrolina in Charlotte. Our staff is required to complete an annual training course and we have



routine inspections to check for compliance with regulations such as freezer temperatures, pest control, and food storage.

Through Feeding America, food pantries have donation partnerships with local grocery stores. CCC is fortunate to receive donations through this program from Wal-Mart, Publix, and Aldi. Our volunteer drivers pick up donations of bread, some produce, and other grocery items from these stores each week.

In addition, we are an approved partner in the Food for Sharing campaign with Publix supermarkets. Twice yearly, donations are accepted at the registers at Publix and CCC is then able to purchase food with these donations.

Our Pendleton Food Lion provides us with all the paper bags we use to pack our food for distribution each day. We are so grateful for the partnerships we have with these retail stores in our area and appreciate all that they do for us.

# **Food Share Program**

CCC is in its second year of serving as a Food-Share SC Fresh Food Box distribution partner site. FoodShare SC aims to increase access to healthy and low-price fruits and vegetables across the Upstate. Additionally, the program supports local farmers by giving them an effective way to distribute their produce. Fresh Food Boxes contain a variety of fruits and vegetables such as squash, greens, apples and potatoes. Recipes are included in the box that reflect the produce provided.

The program is open to everyone in the upstate community. Pickup is twice a month on Wednesday afternoons at CCC. Boxes are \$5 for clients with SNAP benefits and \$20 for those paying cash. Orders must be placed online the week before distribution and are available for pick up from 4-5:30 pm at CCC. Turkeys may be delivered to the back door at CCC Monday-Thursday 8:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m. The Pendleton Food Lion, Ingles in Central, and the Clemson Publix will allow you to leave turkeys after purchase to be picked up daily by CCC volunteers. *Distribution begins November 11.* 





# **Holiday Gift Assistance**



- Holiday help for Thanksgiving and Christmas


